2020 Santa Barbara County Pinot Noir

Santa Barbara County is one of the most diverse growing areas on the West Coast. With soil diversity and unique micro climates, it is exciting to explore and combine different vineyards to make a wine that captures the region as a whole. Biodynamic, Organic and Sustainable farmed vineyards were used to create this bottling.

Tasting Notes

Wild strawberry, cherry and tart cranberry fill the nose with hints of forest floor and dark spice. The palate is full of bright berry fruit and spice, yet delicate and structured.

- 46% Cottonwood Canyon Vineyard(Sustainable Farmed), 33% Presqu'ile Vineyard(Organic Farming), 14% Donnachadh Vineyard(Organic Farming), 7% John Sebastiano Vineyard (Organic Farming).
- 322 cases produced
- Clones 113/115/667/Pommard
- 10% Whole Cluster
- Average 7 day cold soak
- 10% New French Oak, tight grain.
- Average of 14 days on the skins between lots
- 11 months aging on lees
- No fining or filtration
- Basket press
- Gravity movements
